REFUGEE NEWS

The application for our sponsorship of Lama and her four children is still in process at the Canadian Visa Office in Beirut. She has been able to obtain these just recently. So after a long delay we hope that the processing can move forward.

We estimate that we will need \$40,000 for the basic support of Lama and her children for one year. We have reached our target of \$40,000 for Lama and her children. This is wonderful! Thank you so much to all

contributors for your generosity. The Refugee Fund will continue to accept donations, as there may be unexpected expenses, and we expect some months later to welcome Lama's parents and brother. The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry over the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

The first half of April was busy. The Saturday Street Teams made 25 connections with homeless and vulnerable neighbours over the two Saturdays. Spirits were high with the arrival of sunshine. We have a request for men's size 34 waist shorts (or pants that can be made into shorts). Housing is not such a concern when the weather is pleasant. There was an altercation between two of our clients.

The MCU site visit at St. Mary's was quiet. The medical team connected with two clients, while the social service volunteers were able to mingle and talk with people at lunch. One client who is very recently housed stated feeling "overwhelmed" having their own place.

The MCU site visit at St. Augustine's was lively as ever. We are delighted to have Anna, who was a social work practicum student with the MCU last year, back with us as a volunteer now that she has graduated. Welcome back and Congratulations on completing your Social Work degree Anna! The medical table had a steady stream of new and returning clients. The social service table saw 5 clients with various questions and issues.

The MCU also visited the Kitsilano Showers Program, which was relatively quiet. There were five client connections, with two individuals who visited both the medical and social services tables. One client used a volunteer's phone to call family and wish them a Happy Mother's Day. A reminder that commonplace conveniences are often out of reach for many.
