We are in need of the following items for packets to be given to our homeless friends. Socks, Tinned tuna/sardines/beans, individual fruit/dessert packs, fruit juices, Boost supplement. Please leave the items in the bins marked for Neighbourhood Ministry, in the Narthex. Thank you for your continuing support and prayers.

Team 4, Nancy, Meera and I, set out from St. Philip's. We were sent off by Don Lamb, Penni stock and Suzi Noetzel, well provisioned with packets, fruit, sandwiches and hard boiled eggs, blankets and jackets, etc. It was great to see Don back.

At 4th and Highbury we found B, T and D who are all housed; J is still living outdoors and took a backpack; R is still looking for housing and has been working on forms with Vicki. R is looking for a pair of waterproof boots, size 9 1/2. All were happy to take food. We went to Jericho and Locarno beaches and past the hostel but saw no one.

At 4th and Vine we found R on the SW corner with an interesting tower for panhandling, young man, sometimes stays with his mother in Surrey and sometimes outdoors. He took food. Looked quite well. P was at his usual spot on the NE corner selling megaphones. Further along in front of Whole Foods we found N whom we had met once before. He is homeless, says a lawyer is working on housing forms for him. He looked cold but tried a couple of our jackets, found them too small. He would need something larger and waterproof. Also looking for waterproof boots, says size 9, but he is not a small man.

Also along there was R, has housing, looking for work. All happy to take food.

We went down to Granville. No one at the park by VSB today. Likely too cold. We did not see S or G. There were two collections of belongings, including books, one on each side of Granville around 11th. We thought these likely belonged to S and G so left a packet and some other food at each. On the SE corner of Broadway and Granville we met Brooklyn, also called B. New to us, but seemed to know of the NM. very pleasant, happy for the food. He has been homeless for some years, and not sure that he wants housing.

Down Broadway in front of IGA we found S. He was in a good mood as his panhandling had been profitable that morning. As usual he selected items from the packet. Says he is working on housing forms.

In front of the Safeway at Broadway and Macdonald we found S, new to us. He is a veteran, suffers from PTSD. Camps out. He is not sure that he would do well in housing. Not in need of food, but was quite chatty. He told us there were a number of people who sleep in cars at the east and west Spanish Banks beaches but leave quite early in the morning. Not quite sure how we could reach out to them.

On my way home, I left a packet on the West Point Grey United Church porch for B. There were some belongings there but not as many as usual, so wondered if he is still in residence there. I dropped the few remaining perishable items at the 17th and Dunbar building.
