ADVICE FOR ALL MICROPHONE USERS - TO AVOID SOUND SYSTEM FEEDBACK

Readers, announcers, prayer leaders - We received valuable guidance regarding our sound system from Brenda McDonald's grandson - who is a sound engineer and who recently helped establish default settings for the sound system.

The main recommendation: to avoid feedback - is for anyone using the microphones to project and speak directly towards the microphone so the volume does not need to be turned up too high.

Our worship space has very lively acoustics - which is lucky for us, but make the sound system more sensitive to feedback when the volume is turned up. This makes projection and speaking directly towards the microphone 'safer 'than boosting the volume.

We also lent him our phone so he could call home to Tibet and let his mom and dad know he was safe. He hadn't been able to connect with them for a very long time. There were tears all around.
