REFUGEE NEWS

The application for our sponsorship of Lama and her four children is still in process at the Canadian Visa Office in Beirut. Upon receiving our submission explaining that Lama cannot obtain a proper Syrian death certificate for her late husband, the Visa Office asked her to get a document from the Sharia Court and another from a notary. She has been able to obtain these just recently. So, after a long delay we hope that the processing can move forward. We estimate that we will need \$40,000 for the basic support of Lama and her children for one year. We have reached our target of \$40,000 for Lama and her children. This is wonderful! Thank you so much to all contributors for your generosity. The Refugee Fund will continue to accept donations, as there may be unexpected expenses, and we expect some months later to welcome Lama's parents and brother. NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

Rhona Thornton has agreed to be the new Parish Liaison for the Neighbourhood Ministry. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to Don Lamb for his ten years of service in this role and we are excited to welcome Rhona into this her new role.

The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry over the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

The first half of June was very busy for the Neighbourhood Ministry Street Teams. The Saturday Street Teams made 31 connections with homeless and vulnerable neighbours over the two Saturdays. Spirits were high as a result of the lovely weather. Two of our homeless friends have expressed an interest to be housed by winter and have completed the required paperwork. They are now awaiting placement. One of them indicated there were barriers or challenges to obtaining medical needs, and the other homeless persons with him quickly offered out Dr. Janet (who is associated with the Mobile Care Unit) with praise and said they'd hook him up. Much gratitude was expressed for the clothing donations. One of our regulars expresses particular thanks to St. John's Shaughnessy for all the gifts. The MCU site visit at St. Mary's was quiet. The social services team

connected with two clients, while the medical team made 5 connections. The hall was closed at St. Augustine's that week, so the MCU team were unable to make any connections. The MCU also visited the Kitsilano Showers Program. There were five client connections (four returning clients and one new client) who visited with the medical team. Two clients visited with the social services team. One client expressed frustration about the continued wait for housing.
