THE REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP APPLICATION FOR LAMA AND HER CHILDREN:

NOW FORMALLY APPROVED

On July 10 Lama and the diocese received confirmation by e-mail that the refugee sponsorship application for Lama and her children has been approved. They will most likely arrive between mid-August and mid-September. Thanks to all who have contributed so generously to the Refugee Fund, we will be in a good financial situation as we begin our sponsorship. We also have most of the necessary furniture and household effects stored in various places.

The applications for Lama's parents and brother are also in process at the Visa Office in Beirut. Their applications were submitted about 7 months after Lama's, a year ago now. They have not yet been contacted for medical examinations or interviews.

NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

Rhona Thornton has agreed to be the new Parish Liaison for the Neighbourhood Ministry. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to Don Lamb for his ten years of service in this role and we are excited to welcome Rhona into this her new role.

The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry over the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

The Saturday Street Teams made 30 connections with homeless and vulnerable neighbours over the two Saturdays, with five individuals being unfamiliar to the team members. A new volunteer had the opportunity to go out with a team captain on one of the Saturdays, and received a good introduction. More and more people are acquiring housing, or are anticipating being housed soon with the opening of more modular housing units. Some new faces seemed to have trepidations at our first approach to their camp, but were mollified when it became clear that the team was not attempting to evict them from their spot.

The last MCU site visit at St. Mary's was very quiet. The social services team connected with one client. The MCU visit at St. Augustine's was also not overly busy, connecting with new and returning clients. It was a great night in a place so full of community. The MCU also visited the Kitsilano Showers Program. There were five client connections (four returning clients and one new client) who visited with the medical team. Similarly, there were five client connections on the social services team (one new and four returning clients). Most of the visits were to check on housing applications and to receive updates on their status in the system. The new visitor spent time with both teams to learn about what services are offered and to chat.
