A team of volunteers has rented the top of a three-bedroom "Vancouver Special" in South Vancouver near Fraser and 58th. Furniture is to be moved in on Tuesday August 7th. Thanks to folk who have donated furniture and household effects, most furniture has been provided. **The most important need right now is for two single beds (without headboards and footboards) or a set of bunk beds that could fit into a very small bedroom**. The applications for Lama's parents and brother are also in process at the Visa Office in Beirut. Their applications were submitted about 7 months after Lama's, a year ago now. # NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

We are in need of the following items for packets to be given to our homeless friends. Socks, Tinned tuna/sardines/beans, individual fruit/dessert packs, fruit juices, Boost supplement. Please leave the items in the bins marked for Neighbourhood Ministry, in the Narthex. Thank you for your continuing support and prayers. The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood

Ministry over the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

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The beginning of July was relatively quiet. The Saturday Street Teams made 21 connections with homeless and vulnerable neighbours over the two Saturdays, with three individuals being unfamiliar to the team members. All seemed in good moods and willing to chat. Two of our regulars have lost a lot of weight. One of the teams was unable to go down to the beaches because of the Folk Festival. The food packages are appreciated as it is reported that it is difficult to make ends meet. One individual is new to Vancouver and seems very down.

The Camp visit on July 3, made one connection. There is now an active construction zone where there was formerly a camp. The MCU team visited St. Augustine's on July 5. A new volunteer had her very first shift. Welcome Michelle to the team. It was relatively quiet, which was a nice opportunity to review the resource book with the new volunteer. Two connections made on the social service side and the doctor did not receive any medical clients. Kits Showers hosted the MCU team on July 7. It was an active site with five clients on the medical side. Only one of the clients was new to the MCU. The social service table chatted informally with several clients, making arrangements to begin the process of replacing one individual's ID. We experienced the end result of encouragement, patience and understanding when the latter client, a long-time member of the breakfast program, entered our "office" for the first time and conversed with both teams. Dana reports four new faces to the breakfast program.
