REFUGEE NEWS

Lama and her children arrived on September 13. They are getting settled into their new home. School registration for the children is underway. It is not easy for them to be away from their friends and family in Lebanon, and to be unable to communicate with those around them. The children in particular should learn English quickly. Fortunately they have relatives in North Vancouver to visit. The application for Lama's parents, Nasriddin and Fatmeh, and her younger brother, Ward, has been in process at the Canadian Visa Office in Beirut for about a year now. Just this week they have been given appointments for their interviews at the Visa Office. These will take place on October 3. So this is the beginning of activity on this file. Their arrival is likely still some months away. St. John's Shaughnessy agreed to sponsor Lama's sister, Hadeel, with her husband, Bassel, and three young children. St. Philip's has agreed to be co-sponsor for them, contributing some hands on work when they arrive, but not any money. Their application was received at IRCC at the end of August. This is a more educated branch of the family, with quite young children, so should settle in more easily. It will likely be almost 2 years before they arrive. Though we have received many generous donations, there have been some additional expenses for our Refugee Family, therefore donations will be gratefully received. NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry over the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU). The first half of September was busy. The Saturday Street Teams made 26 connections with homeless and vulnerable neighbours over the two Saturdays. Most noted on the visits were the rising need for warmer clothing and rain gear as the weather turns to fall and winter. We were delighted to report that at least five of our long-time homeless neighbours accepted housing at the newest modular housing site at 2nd and Ash. Several volunteers were on hand to help on move in day. The MCU site visit at St. Augustine's was very busy as it was our first MCU visit since July. The new team, which includes Dr. Sari and former social work practicum student Anna, was introduced by the Rev'd Dr. Pitman Potter. The medical team made 5 connections. The social services side made 4 connections: 3 with housing issues and one person looking for a bed, which we were able to source for the client. The MCU also visited the Kitsilano Showers Program, which was relatively quiet. Dr. Janet met with 2 of her regular clients and the social services team made one connection. We were delighted to inform one of our clients that they had been offered a place at the new modular housing complex at 2nd and Ash with a move-in date just days later.
