## St. Philip's Annual Budget and Your Gift

Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. (1 Peter 4:10)

## Your gift supports our shared mission...

What is our mission at St. Philip's, Dunbar? Part of our Mission Statement commits us to:

"engage and serve our parish and larger community with vibrant worship, active outreach and enriching programs for adults, youth and children."

We fulfill this mission with our shared resources of time, talent, and treasure. We all have a role to play in supporting the many activities that go on at St. Philip's every day and throughout the year.

That's why this year's Stewardship Theme is Moving Forward Together.

## Did you know that...

Most of our operating budget comes from donations. In 2017, we received \$286,977 from identified givers, as well as an additional \$5524 from open collection on Sunday mornings. We also received \$86,078 for our Outreach Programs, \$7594 in holiday envelopes, \$42,514 to Designated Funds, and a very generous \$50,000 in Special Donations. All together, we received \$478,687 in donations in 2017.

Volunteer-driven activities such as the *Christmas Fair* and rummage sales generated a further \$25,749. We also receive revenues from rentals of church property and unrealized gains on investments. Total parish revenue from all of the above was \$585,829 in 2017.

This means that almost 82% of our shared resources comes directly from gifts such as yours.

## How your gift gets used...

Here is a snapshot of how all our gifts of time, talent, and treasure were used in 2017:

#### **PEOPLE**

(52% of total General Funds and Outreach budget, \$200,079 total)

More than half of our shared donations were spent on programs for people here at St. Philip's and beyond. Here are only some of the activities that fulfilled our mission to people in and around our community in 2017:

Christian Formation, Pastoral Care, Children, Youth & Family, Outreach, Neighbourhood Ministry, Jones Girls, Men's Fellowship, Senior's Café, Refugee sponsorship, Street ministries, Music...

#### **PLACE**

(48% of total General Funds and Outreach budget, \$194,493)

The above ministries all depend on having a physical place from which to operate. Some of the fixed costs that we must budget for from year to year include: Maintenance and renewal of buildings and facilities, heating, lighting, cleaning, painting, etc. of church, gym, and rectory, Diocesan apportionment

## Why your pledge is important...

Everyone's gift, no matter the size, is important and appreciated. Pledging a total yearly gift helps St. Philip's budget responsibly and allocate funds suitably. Though your generous pledge, **you** make it possible for all of us at St. Philip's to continue our mission of Christ's work in our parish and beyond. There are so many wonderful things going on at St. Philip's... imagine what we could do with even more resources of time, talent, and treasure!

The work of stewarding God's good gifts to us goes on today, tomorrow, and every day. All of us are called to serve one another with whatever gifts we have received from God. Please prayerfully consider how you can add your resources to all of ours in God's work at St. Philip's Dunbar, so that we can truly move forward together!

## **Planning Your Pledge**

The following is intended to help answer questions you may have as you consider how much to pledge to St. Philip's for 2019.

#### Why should I pledge financial support?

Pledging provides a disciplined and faithful way to respond to God's goodness to us. Giving a regular gift to St. Philip's also allows the parish to responsibly plan and carry out the many ministries that go on within the church, the neighbourhood, and beyond. Have a look at the information titled *St. Philip's Annual Budget and Your Gift*, included in this package, to see how your donation will help this community and others.

#### How much should I pledge?

The amount you pledge is a matter for you to decide. Please take time to consider what your financial response to God's faithfulness might be. Remember that returning a portion of your income to the church is a spiritual discipline as well as a practical support of St. Philip's ministries.

The average giving pattern in the Diocese of New Westminster is typically around 1.4% of annual income. St. Philip's has generally been at the top of the pack with annual giving around 2%. Our target this year is for everyone to increase their gift by an additional 2% – which would make all our ministries grow and our deficit disappear. We think 2% more is a reachable target!

The following charts are intended to help you determine the amount of your pledge.

#### How should I set up my giving?

Most people will likely find a monthly gift is the easiest and most convenient way to give. We also encourage you to consider setting up a "PAD" account (Pre-authorized Donation Program) to have regular withdrawals taken directly from your bank account or credit card. A PAD sign-up form is included with this package.

If you decide to give monthly, consider putting a "token toonie" in the offering plate on those Sundays when you're not submitting your envelope. Or, if you give through PAD, give a toonie each Sunday as a small token of your overall gift. This way your gift will be symbolically given back to God at the altar, and overall donations will be just that little bit more.

## What if my circumstances change and I need to change my pledge commitment?

Simply contact the church office to change your pledge. PAD pledges can be changed as well as envelope pledges at any time. All pledge amounts and changes are kept in strict confidence.

## What if I am away for an extended period?

St. Philip's sets its budget on the pledges received, so ongoing giving is appreciated. You can set up a pre-authorized donation through the church office, pay your pledge upfront before you leave, or give post-dated cheques.

#### How else can I give back to God?

Financial support is only one part of Stewardship. St. Philip's needs your time and your talents as well as your treasure in order to continue being a vital Christian community. Please consider getting involved (or more involved!) in the many ministries that go on at the church. There are opportunities to get involved on Sunday mornings through reading, leading prayers, singing in the choir, welcoming newcomers, serving coffee, teaching children, and more. There are midweek ministries such as outreach, pastoral care, and street ministries. Your time and your talents are gifts to the church as much as your treasure.

In this package you will find a *Skills, Gifts, and Vision* questionnaire – this is an opportunity to take some time to think about the unique gifts **you** have to offer to our community, as well as a chance to share your vision and dream for what St. Philip's could become in the future.

# How should I split my pledge between St. Philip's and my other charitable giving?

Many charitable organizations and good causes need financial support. St. Philip's is one of those good causes! Our response to God is comprised of all the ways we give back. Please consider what portion St. Philip's plays in your personal life, and give accordingly.
