NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry for the end of February, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

The snow prevented our team from going to St. Augustine's, but our MCU team was able to visit Kits Showers and M. Mitchell Place. The MCU social service teams visiting Kits Showers and M. Mitchell Place served a total of 6 clients. The Street Teams made 21 connections in the Neighbourhood.

Volunteers with the MCU program met one evening to talk about how things are going at each of the 3 sites. Stories of inspiration, as well as challenges were shared. In addition, the social work students presented some of the project work they are doing as part of their practicum with the MCU, including development of an online resource manual to aid volunteers with their work.
