

GIFT PLANNING SEMINAR: SUNDAY JUNE 23 WITH DR. ED FIDLER, PH.D

You are invited to attend a presentation about all aspects of charitable giving by Certified Financial Planner Dr. Ed Fidler after worship on Sunday June 23rd in the Fireside Room.

Q. Why haven't funds been set aside each year for building maintenance, etc.?

A. There has not been a regular surplus available to set aside for maintenance. Occasionally, when a large gift was made and was not required immediately to balance the budget, the surplus has been used to grow one of the two endowment funds.

Q. Why not just use our Endowment Funds? There's \$1.5 million in capital in them.

A. According to their terms of reference, a portion of revenue from these endowments is available to support our operating budget or small special projects in the future. To preserve that for the future, the capital is protected by the Endowment Committee.

Q. Why am I asked to make a pledge instead of a one-time gift?

A. The success of the campaign rests on pledges payable over a period of time, which may allow you to contribute more than would be possible in a one-time gift. You will also be able to spread the charitable tax benefits over three taxation years.

Q. Can I make a gift other than cash?

A. Certainly. Gifts of stocks, securities and other financial vehicles are welcomed and encouraged. Maximize your tax savings when making a gift. Dr. Ed Fidler presents on June 23rd. He is also offering cost-free and confidential consultations to our parishioners.
