Today is Neighbourhood Ministry Sunday. Thank-you very much for all of your donations which have been especially plentiful these past few weeks.

The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry from the beginning of May (October 15-



October 30 inclusive), including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

Over the course of the last two weeks, the MCU social service teams visiting St. Augustine's and Kits Showers served a total of 6 clients, and the medical side served several as well. The Street Teams made 27 connections in the Neighbourhood.

The end of October marked the beginning of the new social work students' practicum with the Neighbourhood Ministry. Welcome Casey and Sidney! One of our street team gifted her own hat to one of our friends who needed a warm hat... giving the shirts off our backs and the hats off our heads!

Thank you to the parishioners from St. Anselm's, St. Philip's, St. Helen's and St. John's Shaughnessy, who have donated items and clothing so that we can be so amply supplied on Saturdays.

Thanks to your returned Capital Campaign pledges worth over \$830,000 so far, the Property Committee has received a \$215,000 budget from Trustees to replace roofs on the Hall, Church and Rectory. Furthermore, as a result of a very generous anonymous donation of \$30,000, Trustees on Oct. 9 authorized an *increased* roofing budget to enable a choice of Eco Roof Shakes on the church building. Several churches on the North Shore have chosen

this product for their sanctuaries: North Lonsdale United Church and West Vancouver United Church to name two.

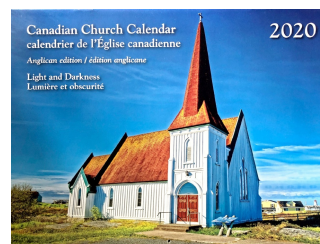


MONDAY MANTRAS
